Sheriff mum about death after standoff

Fatality not reported until day after Friday's shooting

The Hays County Sheriffs Department is not releasing additional information about the cause of death of Kevin Ray Rodriguez, 20, of Buda on Friday evening.

"It is an ongoing investigation," Sergeant Phil Taylor said when explaining why further information would not

be released.
Rodriguez died inside a
home on the 800 block of
Crest Circle Drive. The incident is being investigated as
a burglary.

At the scene on Friday evening, authorities did not

disclose that a body was found, but a press release sent out by the county Saturday afternoon said Rodriguez had suffered a gunshot wound and was pronounced dead by Precinct 1-2 Justice of the Peace Margie Hernandez.

Authorities responded to the house for a call of a burglary in progress.

The homeowner told police he heard people inside of his house, and there was a bicycle outside they did not recognize. The press release said that the owner did "fire a weapon in the residence," but did not indicate if he shot Ro-

Passing ordinance on agenda

The San Marcos City Council will meet to discuss a proposed, new ordinance and the possible use of eminent domain among other agenda items in tonight's 5:30 p.m. meeting.

The new ordinance would create a safe passing distance for cars requiring at least three feet of space between a car and a vulnerable road user like a bicyclist. It also would amend the city's code to make parking in a bike lane a violation.

"This standard safe passing distance will help protect vulnerable road users and will be a valuable tool for educational programs and safety awareness campaigns," information provided by the city said. "However, exceptions to the standard passing distance will be allowed to accommodate the reasonable flow of traffic."

Currently, parking in a bike lane is legal, but if passed, the ordinance would make it a
